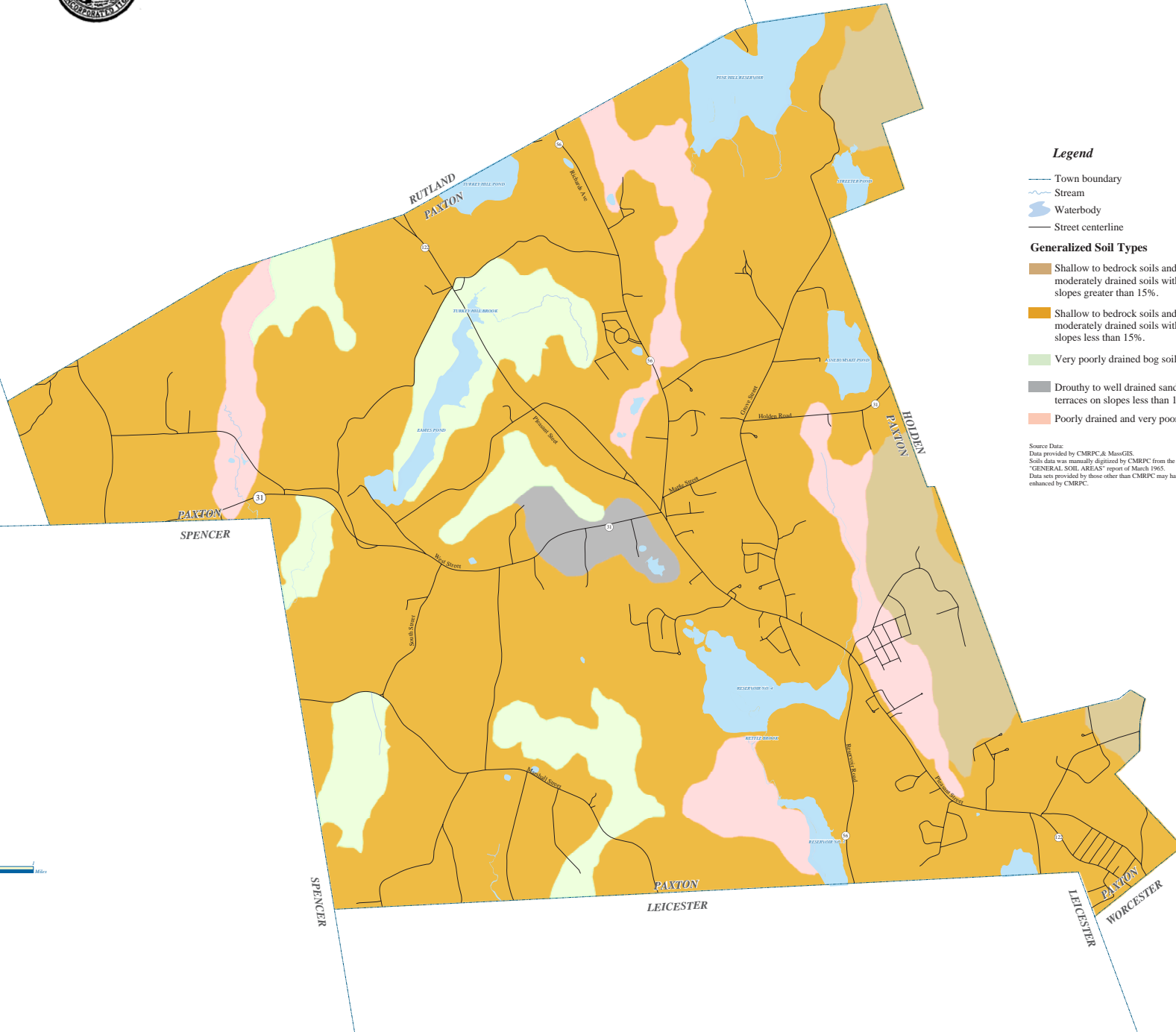
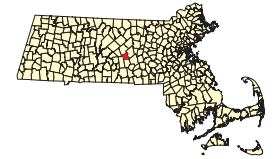


TOWN OF PAXTON

Soils & Unique Geologic Features Map



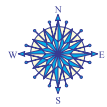

Generalized Soil Types

- Shallow to bedrock soils and deep, well drained and moderately drained soils with hardpans on upland slopes greater than 15%.
- Shallow to bedrock soils and deep, well drained and moderately drained soils with hardpans on upland slopes less than 15%.
- Very poorly drained bog soils.
- Drouthy to well drained sandy and gravelly soils on terraces on slopes less than 15%.
- Poorly drained and very poorly drained mineral soils.
