

Trick or Treat?

Forrest Edward Mars Sr. (1904–1999) received a patent for producing M&Ms in 1941. The two 'M's represent the names Mars and Bruce Murrie, of the Hershey Chocolate empire, who invested in the familiar treat. The arrangement allowed the candies to be made with Hershey chocolate.



In 1949, the company introduced the tagline "The milk chocolate that melts in your mouth, not in your hand." In 1950, a black "M" was imprinted on the candies giving them a unique trademark. It was changed to white in 1954.

Our counselor is available, by appointment, the third Thursday of each month.

ANNUAL REPORT

(EXCERPT FROM FY23 REPORT)

The Council on Aging (COA) is a department of the Town of Paxton. The COA staff consists of a full-time Director/Outreach Coordinator, a part-time Program Assistant, and three Van Drivers. The COA has a nine-member Advisory Board.

The COA continues to see growth in our senior community. There are approximately 1,184 residents 60 years of age and older in Paxton based on the 2022 census.

We will see further expansion of our senior population as we look into the future. That growth means adapting to the needs of our older seniors and meeting the needs of our much younger senior population, working to create diverse services for all ages through advocacy and support.

Outreach helps assist senior residents to remain safely in their homes by advocating for services that will enhance their lives, support their independence, and promote their wellbeing. The Outreach Coordinator also serves as a liaison to the departments of Police and Fire.

Our nutrition program offers home delivered meals five days a week, as well as congregate dining at the Senior Center three days a week. This past year we served over 5,500 total meals.

Our Food Pantry helps supplement those individuals who may need assistance throughout the year.

Van transportation is available to all seniors.

The Senior Center provides a welcoming destination for all. It's a place to meet old friends and make new ones. A variety of programs/events are ongoing throughout the year for all ages and stages of life.

Other programs consist of a breakfast café, exercise, wellness and informational programs, book club, IT assistance, and a veteran's group. Weekly activities include a walking group, knitting group, bowling, cards games, and piano lessons. All focus on our senior's needs, wellbeing, interests and independence.

As we look ahead, the COA will continue to work hard in providing support and advocacy for all our seniors.


