TOWN WARRANT.

COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

WORCESTER, MASS.

To either of the Constables of the Town of Paxton, in the County of Worcester.

GREETING:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the town of Paxton, qualified to vote in elections and town affairs, to meet in Allen Hall in said Paxton, on Monday the 5th day of March, next, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to act on the following articles, namely:

Article 1.—To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2.—To hear the reports of the town officers and committees and act thereon.

Article 3.—To bring in and deposit their ballots for Town Clerk, three Selectmen, three Assessors of Taxes, three Overseers of the Poor, a Town Treasurer, a Collector of Taxes, an Auditor, two Constables, each for the term of one year; one member of the School Committee for three years, two Trustees of the Public Library for three years and one Trustee of the Public Library to fill the unexpired term of Anna Woodruff; three members of the Board of Health, and one Superintendent of Streets, each for the term of one year. Also upon the same ballot to vote "Yes or No" on the question "Shall License be granted for the sale of intoxicating liquors in this town?" All the above to be voted for on one ballot. Also to choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year. The polls will be open at Eleven o'clock A. M. and close at three o'clock P. M.

Article 4.—To see what sums of money the town will grant and appropriate for the support of the Town's Poor; for the repair of Highways and Bridges; for the support of the Public Schools and Transportation of Scholars; and for Contingent charges or act in any way thereon.

Article 5.—To see what disposition the town will make of its dog fund.

Article 6.—To see if the town will grant a sum of money for Memorial Day and for the relief of indigent and disabled soldiers as provided by law.

Article 7.—To see if the town will grant a sum of money for the care and lighting of the street lamps or act in any way thereon.

Article 8.—To see if the town will vote a discount on taxes paid before a given date and fix a time when interest shall be charged and taxes be made payable and likewise fix the compensation to be paid the Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year or take any action in relation thereto.

Article 9.—To see if the town will grant a sum of money with which to pay a proper charge of an Insurance Company for acting as Surety on official bonds required by the town officers and authorize the Selectmen to approve the same or act in any way thereon.

Article 10.—To see if the town will authorize the Town Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes by and with the approval of the Selectmen or act in any way thereon.

Article 11.—To see if the town will vote to accept the list of Jurors as prepared by the Selectmen.

Article 12.—To see if the town will fix the compensation for labor on the Highways the ensuing year.

Article 13.—To see what action the town will take in regard to the care and renting of the Town Hall and the care of the Town Clock the ensuing year.

Article 14.—To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to petition the State Highway Commission to construct an additional piece of State Road in this town or act in any way thereon.

Article 15.—To see if the town will grant a sum of money to be expended by the Tree Warden; also for the improvement of the common or the sidewalks or act in any way thereon.

Article 16.—To see if the town will vote to choose a Board of Trustees to care for the different Trust Funds of the town.

Article 17.—To see if the town will authorize a survey of the "Howe Place" (so-called) and replace the line fences where needed, and grant a sum of money therefor.

Article 18.—To see if the town will authorize the printing of the Valuation and Tax List before the time that taxes are made payable.

Article 19.—To see if the town will grant a sum of money for ladders and other articles used to prevent fires in the town.

Article 20.—To see if the town will furnish a new carpet for the Town Hall and grant a sum of money for the same.

Article 21.—To see if the town will authorize the Town Clerk or Town Treasurer or other officers of the town to give a suitable deed to holders of Cemetery lots in Paxton public cemetery situated next adjoining and north of the First Congregational Church in Paxton or act in any way thereon.

Article 22.—To see if the town will vote to abate certain taxes.

Article 23.—To see if the town will grant a sum of money with which to purchase a new hearse for the use of the town or act in any way thereon.

Article 24.—To see if the town will grant a sum of money for the purpose of purchasing a new stove and crockery for the kitchen in the Town Hall or act in any way thereon.

And you are hereby directed to serve this warrant by posting attested copies thereof, one at Post Office and one at the Blacksmith's shop in said Paxton, ten days at least before the time set for holding said meeting.

Hereof fail not and make due return of this warrant with your doings thereof to the Town Clerk at the time and place of meeting as aforesaid.
